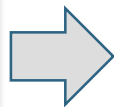

The Self-Injurious Behaviour Clinic provides a tertiary-level assessment and recommendations for children with neurodevelopmental differences who experience self-injurious behaviour in BC

**Self Injurious Behaviour affects up to 50% of children with ASD (Summers et al. 2017). It also affects children with specific genetic conditions (Deb, 1998.)**

3. Family Feedback meeting with Community Support Members

## Transition to Pandemic & Virtual Care

- Our Population experiences decreased support with pandemic restrictions
- Children are assessed virtually at home, group home or school
- Greater level of community support present for family virtual feedback meetings
- Child receives in person physical assessment with paediatrician
